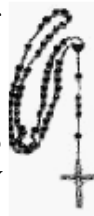
Mother Teresa's Daily Prayer

Catechesis Corner:

Blessed be God,
blessed be His Holy Name.

Moses said to God, "If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you', and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you'. . . this is my name for ever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations." (from CCC #205)

God is *person*, and, He has a name, "I AM WHO AM" or YHWH. The people of Israel respected the holiness and mystery of the name YHWH and did not pronounce it...instead they used the word "LORD" (in Hebrew *Adonai*, in Greek *Kyrios*). *Jesus is recognized as God when we give Him that title: "Jesus is LORD."*

The name of Jesus is the "name, which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (Philippians 2:5-10). Catholic custom is to bow our heads at the sound of the name of Jesus. The name "Jesus" is a prayer in itself. The first miracle of the apostolic Church was when Peter and John invoked the name of Jesus in the healing of a lame beggar. The Church ends many of her prayers with "in the *name* of Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord"

"And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything *in the name of the Lord Jesus*, giving thanks to God the Father through him." *Colossians 3:17*
