### We Are PRO LIFE

**Abortion hurts women. Studies show that women are sometimes coerced to have abortions they don't freely choose. When we are in a time of stress and are called upon to make important decision it may be hard to think clearly. Society, school counselors, boyfriends and parents may encourage abortion as a solution to a temporary difficulty. But abortion means that a living human person's life is ended. Adoption means that person has a chance at life.**

... opposition to intrinsic evils, such as abortion, euthanasia, genocide, embryonic stem-cell research and same sex unions is always required by the faithful Catholic. Because these intrinsic evils are *direct attacks on human life and marital dignity, they are nonnegotiable for every Catholic.*

Catholics must recognize, too, that in the other human life issues -- such as immigration, capital punishment, the economy, health-care and war -- the dignity of the human person must first and foremost be taken into consideration in seeking solutions to these questions.

... We must constantly, at every level, promote the dignity of the human person and the truth that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God from the moment of his or her conception until natural death.

### Holy Communion is the bomb!

Benedict XVI wrote a neat little book called *Sacramentum Caritatis* or *Sacrament of Charity* in English—in it he talks all about the Mass. He wants us to understand that the Mass is just not a repetition of the last supper. The remembrance of Jesus' perfect gifts to us is in the Eucharist itself—in the "radical newness" of Christian worship. "The substantial conversion of bread and wine into His body and blood introduces within creation the principle of a radical change, a sort of nuclear fission, to use an image familiar to us today, which penetrates to the heart of all being, a change meant to set off a process leading ultimately to the transfiguration of the entire world, to the point where God will be all in all." (#11) - *emphasis added*



## Heart Speaks to Heart!

"Where does prayer come from? Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole man who prays. But in naming the

source of prayer, Scripture speaks sometimes of the soul or the spirit, but most often of the heart (*more than a thousand times*). According to Scripture, it is the *heart* that prays. If our heart is far from God, the words of prayer are in vain. "The heart is the dwelling-place where I am, where I live; according to the Semitic or Biblical expression, the heart is the place "to which I withdraw." The heart is our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason and of others; only the Spirit of God can fathom the human heart and know it fully. The heart is the place of decision, deeper than our psychic drives. It is the place of truth, where we choose life or death. It is the place of encounter, because as image of God we live in relation: it is the place of covenant." *Catechism 2562-2563*
