Grace and Mercy

God does not IMPOSE peace on us. He helps us find the way to live in peace.

92 years ago—on May 5, during the horror of the First World War, Pope Benedict XV asked the faithful everywhere to plead for peace through Mary. Eight days later Mary came to three children: Lucia, Jacinta, and Francesco, just outside the little village of Fatima, Portugal. In a series of meetings she taught the children about the seriousness of sin and the suffering it causes. She taught about the reality of Grace and the importance of Prayer and praying Rosary daily for world peace. She, who as a young virgin had accepted the cooperative role that God requested of her, said "Sacrifice yourselves for sinners, and say many times, especially whenever you make some sacrifice: "O Jesus, it is for love of You, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary." **Miracle of the Sun - October 13, 1917** Heavy rains in western Europe soaked the approximately 70,000 persons had gathered in Fatima to see a promised miracle. The crowd included skeptics and reporters from secular papers. Our Lady appeared in the sky. The three children were given a vision of St. Joseph holding the Child Jesus and blessing the world, along with more visions of Mary. The sun began to twirl in the sky, shoot out colored rays and move erratically. It suddenly seemed to zoom close to the earth. The rain drenched crowd shouted and cried out. When the sun went back to its place, the entire crowd and ground were perfectly dry. **"O my Jesus, forgive us, save us from the fire of Hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those who are most in need."**

Would you like to know more about the people—the "who and when and what" of the Bible? It can be confusing. Holy Scripture is a collection of history, poetry, wisdom and prophetic books. These books are not arranged in a sequence to give a simple understanding of the flow of events. You can simplify the narrative by reading these history books: Genesis, Exodus, Numbers, Joshua, Judges, First and Second Samuel, First and Second Kings, Ezra, Nehemiah, First Maccabees, Luke, and the Acts of the Apostles. Leaving out the other books for now makes it easier to follow the thread of events and people.

Read humbly and with an open heart. Try *not* to put meaning *into* His word to fit a certain paradigm. Pray to the Holy Spirit before you read, ask questions, refer to the Catechism online to find Church teaching about particular questions.

Respect for human life means respect for the dignity of the human person. Catholics are against terrorism, torture, and mutilation! We can never do evil because we hope good will come of it.

"Kidnapping and hostage taking bring on a reign of terror; by means of threats they subject their victims to intolerable pressures.

They are morally wrong. **Terrorism threatens, wounds, and kills indiscriminately; it is gravely against justice and charity.**

Torture which uses physical or moral violence to extract confessions, punish the guilty, frighten opponents, or satisfy hatred is contrary to respect for the person and for human dignity.

Except when performed for strictly therapeutic medical reasons, directly intended amputations, **mutilations, and sterilizations performed on innocent persons are against the moral law**" Catechism # 2297

Participation of Catholics in Political Life

.... the Church teaches that authentic freedom does not exist without the truth.

"Truth and freedom either go together hand in hand or together they perish in misery". (John Paul II, *Fides et Ratio*, 90)

In a society in which truth is neither mentioned nor sought, every form of authentic exercise of freedom will be weakened, opening the way to libertine and individualistic distortions and undermining the protection of the good of the human person and of the entire society.
